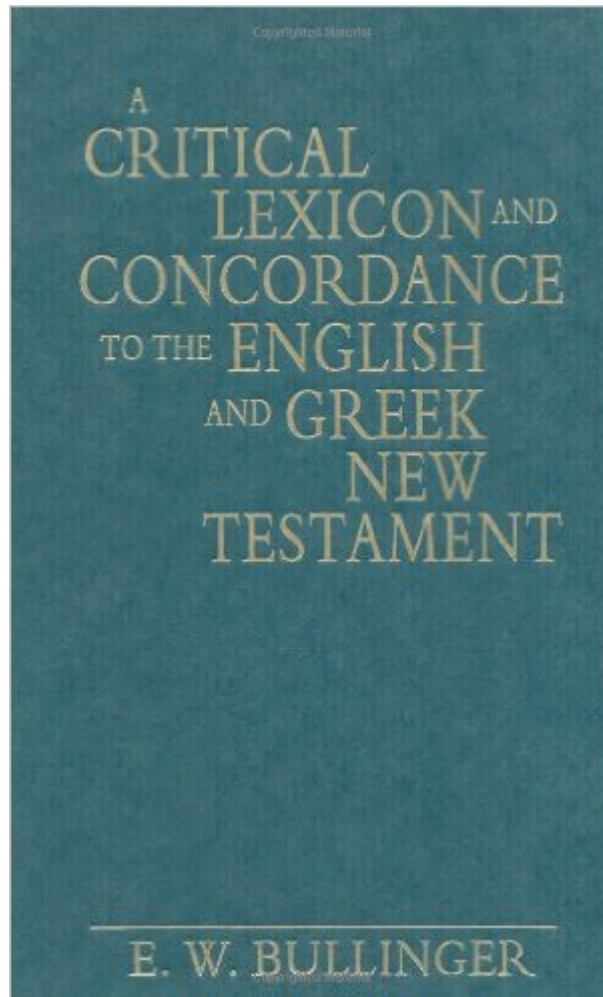


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A Critical Lexicon And Concordance To The English And Greek New Testament

Although Strongs Concordance should be on every serious bible study shelf, this book expands more to the original meaning of words used in the New Testament. I recommend it for those who want an expanded definition and ideas to what the original words meant.

An excellent addition to any library. Easy to use, but if you have no knowledge of Greek, the words are not transliterated for you. However, that won't hinder you from digging truths from the New Testament using this book. If I had to replace all my Greek study books for any reason, I would start with this one - it's the most used in my modest collection.

Most helpful with Bible word study. E. W. Bullinger was years ahead of his time. His concise notes are most helpful. The entry on "The Word of God" alone justifies the price of the book. Print could be larger. Exceptional value used.

As the other reviewers have said this is definitely a book you need to have in your collection along

with a good Strong's Concordance and Thayer's Greek-English Lexicon (ISBN: 1565632095). For the most part if these three books agree about the definition of a word you can take it as that. In some cases I have seen the three disagree, but that should just lead you into a more in-depth Bible study that is bound to help you grow spiritually.

I have benefitted from this Lexicon for 37 years. I wouldn't even have one had it not been for my husband obtaining a graduate degree in theology. Just this week a study guide question for my current Bible study in I Thessalonians asked participants to look up the words 'grace' and 'peace' in a dictionary. I looked them up in this lexicon to know the real meaning according to the original languages and intended use in the particular context. It is so much more accurate, deep and rich than the dictionary definition. One does not need to know Greek or Hebrew to use and benefit from having E.W. Bullinger's Critical Lexicon and Concordance. I purchased this for a sixteen year old serious student of the Word as an accurate resource.

I own this concordance as well as strong's and young's. This one is by far the most informative, easy to use, and gets the most use in my house-hold. I have not found a Lexicon/concordance that is more insightful than this one (which doesn't mean one doesn't exist). The definitions in this concordance are clear, open up your understanding to God's word, and I actually find it easier to use than Strong's and Young's (it is designed to go alphabetical by the english word, and then you find the greek words that are used in translation with the verses under the english word). This book is truly more informative than anything else I've seen. For me this is a MUST OWN!!! You won't be disappointed by this book.

Sometimes we need to look up the true meaning of a word in the greek to really understand what the Holy Spirit is trying to teach us. This is a great tool for that,

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
