

You will hardly find me with a non-fiction book. I don't like reading them, I disagree with most of them, and I think fiction is the bee's knees. But Ms. Downs has changed my opinion. This once. ;) Ms. Downs brings us a book all about learning to love ourselves and how to praise God with our bodies. My expectations were set. I was ready to disagree. But I was happily disappointed. Instead,

I was smiling and laughing at Ms. Down's down-to-earth writing and I was thinking through everything she said. I loved the first two chapters so much I corralled my cousin Tabitha into reading through the book with me! Through the book, Ms. Down discusses mind, eyes, ears, mouth, shoulders, heart, hands, stomach, knees, and lastly feet. At the end of every chapter she's formed little "activities" which include Bible verses to read, words to look up in the dictionary, and things to think on. I accepted all her advice at the end of each chapter and performed some (sadly not all, but I will go back and do them!) of the "activities". To conclude, Ms. Down makes you feel like you're her best friend. She shares stories from her personal life, recipes which can be found in the Appendix, and gives solid advice. I bought this book for my 15 year old daughter and asked my wife to read it first. She read the first two chapters and said "this is not the book for my daughter." The first two chapters talked about physical appearance and recommended waxing eyebrows, wearing make-up, wearing jewelry, asking a friend whose fashion sense you admire to go with you to pick out jewelry. This is the last thing we want anyone to tell our daughter. We are happy that she already does not worry about her physical appearance. Then I picked up where my wife left off and began reading chapter 3. I couldn't believe what I was reading! People are to be judged by the way their eyes look?!! The author mentions reading about a football player from high school that she liked, for 90 minutes on facebook, and does not talk about all the huge number of reasons why this is bad!!! Instead it just leads to a joke about a pro football player she liked. And she talks about how she could judge a rock musician by the way his eyes looked. She said her friend told her he was a nice guy, which she was able to dismiss because he looked freaky!!! Annie, there are many endocrine and neurological conditions that lead to a person's eyes being unappealing in this way, which could be genetic or from malnutrition or injury. It's true that the rock musician may have used drugs which lead to some damage. That is a complicated moral situation for a young girl if she is to get to know him. But the Bible passage you quote from Mathew about the way a person's eyes look is not about the physical appearance of a person's eyes, it is about the way they view the world! For example, whether you judge a person by their appearance!!! Look at the other passages in Mathew!!! Does it say something about what you are to wear? Yes it does, it says do not worry about the clothes you wear!!!
